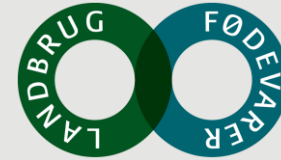

Results of the tripartite negotiations



CO2: Climate tax on pigs and cattle with deduction for best practice



Forestry: +38% more forest



Groundwater: Mapping of threats - > new measures



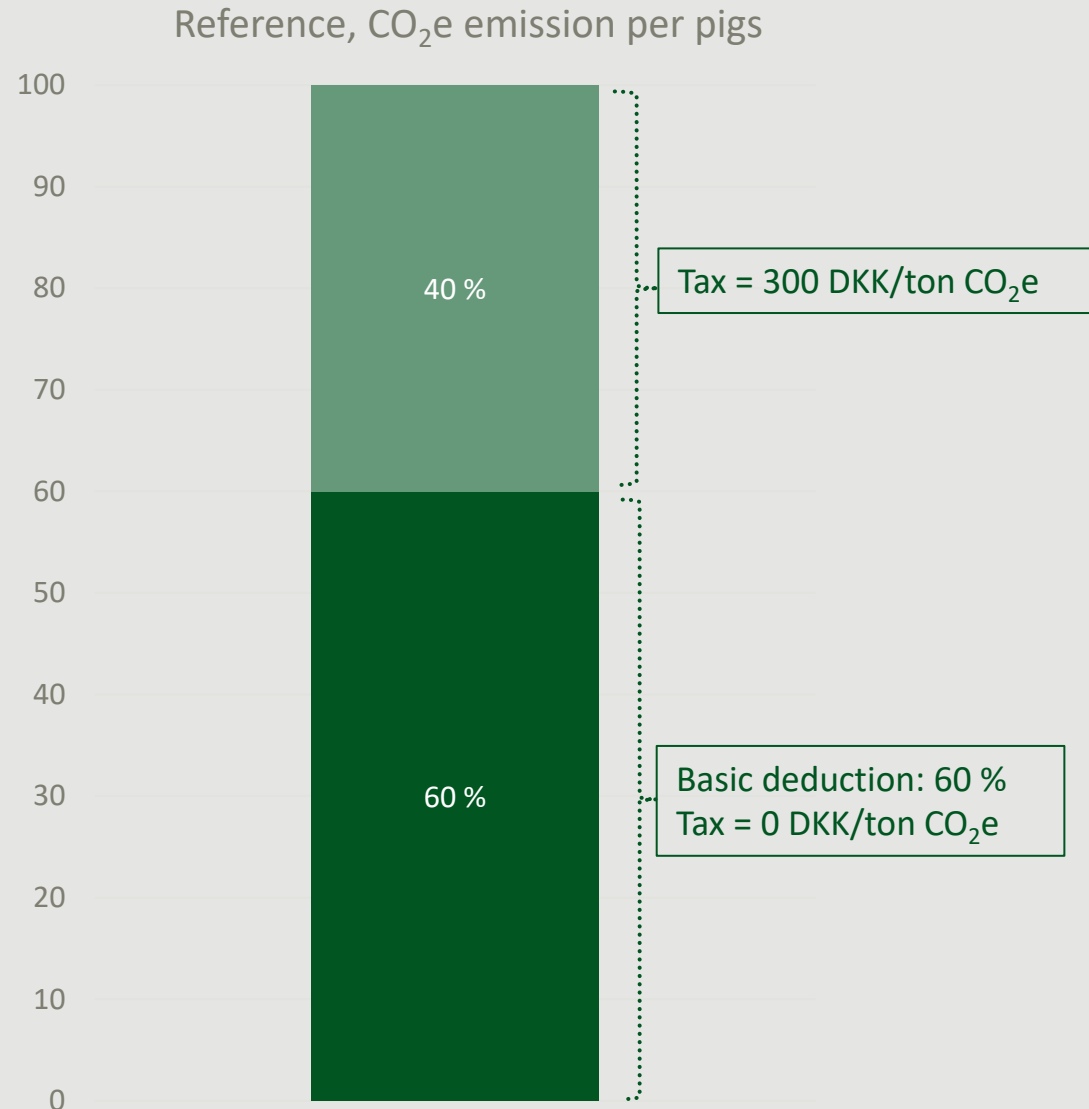
Nature and biodiversity: More than 20% of DK protected nature



Coastal waters in good condition

Land use change: 15% of agricultural land -> forest /protected nature

Climate tax on pigs and cattle



We expect:

- A reference emission for a slaughter pig, piglet and sow
- Several climate measures will be tested in the coming years
- These climate measures are approved by 2030
- Climate measures reduce emissions by 40% = DKK 0 in tax



Implementation

- For the first time in Danish history, a ministry is created solely to implement a political agreement
- Difficult task → Potential conflicts between landowners, authorities and green interests.
- The new minister is Jeppe Bruus (S) → Previously the Minister of Taxation
- Implementation of the agreement will largely rely on local green partnerships nationwide
